This yielded 27 studies. Analysis of those studies found the natural diet of a domestic feral cat, on average, is (on a dry matter basis) 62.7% protein. 22.8% fat. 11.8% minerals. 2.8% carbohydrates. The amount of carbohydrates cats naturally eat is very, very small.

The domestic cat ' s natural diet consists of small rodents and mammals. On average a prey item is 62% animal derived protein, 10% fat with 14% ash, which is mainly mineral content from bone (see the table below).

Ideally, however, your cat ' s diet should contain no more than 10% carbohydrate from any source.
