Dysphagia is the medical term for swallowing difficulties. Some people with dysphagia have problems swallowing certain foods or liquids, while others can't swallow at all. Other signs of dysphagia include: coughing or choking when eating or drinking. bringing food back up, sometimes through the nose. a sensation that food is stuck in your throat or chest.

Treatment may include the use of drugs (e.g. botulinum toxin injections), surgery and/or endoscopic therapy; Administration of medications to patients with swallowing difficulties

Being underweight is associated with profound and multiple learning disabilities (PMLD) where other feeding complexities are likely i.e. dysphagia, reflux, enteral feeding. While greater risk of obesity is seen in more independent populations and those with Downs Syndrome and Prader-Willi Syndrome. (NHS Digital, 2019).

What do dietitians need to know when seeing a patient with ...

Dysphagia is defined as difficulty, discomfort or pain in swallowing. Dysphagia is usually caused by another health condition and may be mild to severe. Dysphagia can result from any disruption at the preparatory, oral, pharyngeal and/or oesophageal stages of swallowing.
